ZERO RECOGNITION FOR ADDITIONAL WORK

Additional Workload? GUSD says:



Today, GTA's bargaining team and GUSD's bargaining team met to discuss GTA's Sept. 9 Quarantine Instruction proposal. GUSD presented a counter-proposal that DID NOT ACKNOWLEDGE the **increased workload** due to Dr. Ekchian's *imposed* Administrative Regulations 6157 for quarantine instruction issued on Aug. 31.

GUSD's October 6 counter proposal included the following:

- \$0 in additional compensation for the **increased workload** due to pivoting to full distance learning due to whole class quarantines
- \$0 in additional compensation for the **increased workload** due to pivoting to concurrent instruction due to partial class or individual quarantines
- \$0 in additional compensation for the **increased workload** due to additional preparation and training related to quarantine instruction
- \$0 in additional compensation for the **increased workload** due to Service Providers who need to reschedule services due to quarantine
- \$0 in additional compensation for the **increased workload** due to additional office hours, study sessions, tutoring, or virtual lessons that teachers may choose to provide during non-instructional time for quarantined students.
- \$0 in additional compensation for the **increased workload** due to teachers and counselors completing documentation, meetings, and paperwork for quarantined students who enter a short term Independent Study Program.

While the district was willing to compensate new teachers (hired after June 1, 2021) to attend professional development and for nurses to work overtime, GUSD's Bargaining Team WOULD NOT ACKNOWLEDGE that Dr. Ekchian's imposed regulations have increased the workload of GTA members.
